

# Queen Victoria commemoratives

I recently won a sterling silver thimble on ebay that commemorated the visit of Victoria & Albert to Scotland in Sept 1842. This thimble was an exciting find for me, as we had just returned from the most wonderful cruise in the Inner Hebrides of Scotland. This has prompted me to update the chapter of Dorothy Friend's *British commemorative and souvenir thimbles* of 1987. Her chapter 2 is entitled 'The years 1837-1901' which covers the entire reign of Queen Victoria.

In this year of Queen Elizabeth II's diamond jubilee, it is interesting to look back over the thimbles produced for her reign 1952- . Sadly, there is only one silver thimble design produced in England for QEII's diamond jubilee, where there is a plethora of china "cheap and cheerful" - something unheard of during Queen Victoria's reign. By contrast there were 13 different sterling silver thimbles produced for the ascension of Queen Victoria in 1837 and/or her coronation in 1838.

Many of the thimbles produced about Victoria attempted to record the many events of her life especially in the early and later parts of her reign and these are in the form of raised lettering around the thimbles to record the event. To feature in this section there should be a date, which is different from the Victorian (ie era) Scenic thimbles.

Tho Victoria and Albert had nine children, only the first two had thimbles produced to commemorate their births (ie for Victoria and Edward). At this stage no recorded thimbles were struck for their other children Alice, Albert, Helena, Louise, Arthur, Leopold, and Beatrice.

Most of these thimbles are not hallmarked, nor do we know at this stage who made them. They are rare too, being the age, they are!

A word of caution here - replicas and reproductions! During the 1980s both Stephen Frost and Westair Reproductions made pewter thimbles that feature Victoria - Westair's is not even a replica - it is just lettered 'Victoria & Albert 1840'. Frost's is a reproduction of the 1897 jubilee thimble. Both are heavy and should NOT be confused with the sterling silver originals - the weight should be a dead giveaway!! I have included these at the end, to complete the record.

I have tried to keep the order consecutive using the last date mentioned on the thimbles - some of the later thimbles bear no date but the event is well recorded!

I have **not** repeated commemorative thimbles of Victoria from these topics.

I have not gone out seeking needlework tools featuring Queen Victoria but as I found images, they have been included within the sequence of the thimbles.

I understand that fraudulent sterling silver copies made their way onto the market in the 1990s - so buyer beware!!

From reading a 2001 article on these fakes in *At your Fingertips*, I understand that the fakes weigh 6.9grams whereas the originals weigh 6.3grams!!

**THE QUEEN'S RECORD THIMBLE**

Given the current vogue for commemorative thimbles, it is not every day that a new type of commemorative thimble is discovered which has been lying unrecognised. Most collectors know the Queen's Record thimble, the thimble which claims to be the best of all thimbles, but how many realise that this is in fact a Diamond Jubilee thimble? Not many obviously, since it would otherwise be recorded as such in books of reference and would certainly be more avidly collected. Yet that is precisely what the Queen's Record thimble is: A thimble commemorating Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897.

We do not pretend to know how the "Queen's Record" thimble came into being but suffice it to say that a firm calling itself Hirst Bros. from Oldham, Lancashire, and describing itself as a depot for tools, materials and sundries for jewellers etc., a wholesale distributor in fact, was advertising it in a trade magazine in 1897. The wording of the advertisement reads as follows:

**VICTORIA DIAMOND JUBILEE**  
The latest and best Novelty  
-Rd 291339-

Plush lined case, glass front	Gold blocked circular rim
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The "Queen's Record" 6<sup>th</sup> Thimble "The best of all"  
Warranted silver-cased

On the face of it, therefore, the design of the Queen's Record Thimble was registered but as those fortunate enough to own one can easily check it does not carry a registered number. On investigation the registered number turns out to be that of a show case - a case for displaying thimbles - and not that of the thimbles themselves. Moreover the show case design was registered by Charles Iles. There can be little doubt, therefore, that Charles Iles made the Queen's Record thimbles either on their own account or on account of Hirst Bros. and that the latter, in an effort to give the thimble a semblance of exclusivity, associated with it the registered number of the display case. How far Charles Iles were involved in this deception it is impossible to say but those who think that hard selling methods are a modern development might be surprised at what went on last century. The important thing, however, is that the above advertisement provides proof that the Queen's Record thimble was definitely a commemorative. They can safely be reclassified as such and we have little doubt that in months to come they will become increasingly sought after.

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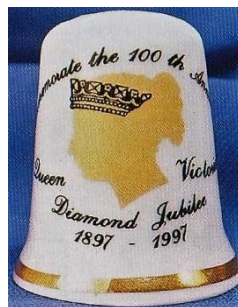

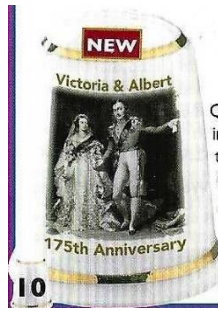
